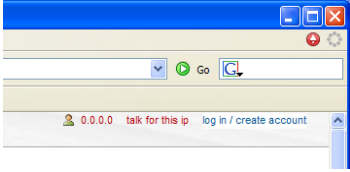


Steps to Begin Building out a Standards Page

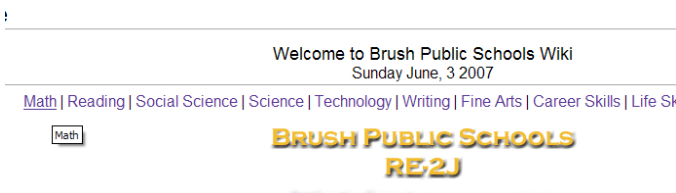
1. Start with standards that have been identified as Essential Skills
2. Go to <http://wiki.brushschools.org/>
3. Click on the **Log in** link at the top right (Username is your email address)



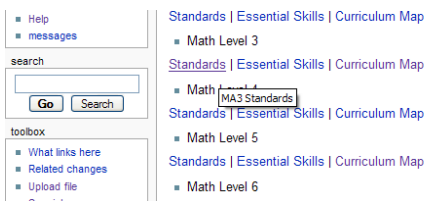
4. Click **Main Page** in the Navigation pane at the left



5. Click on the Content Area Link



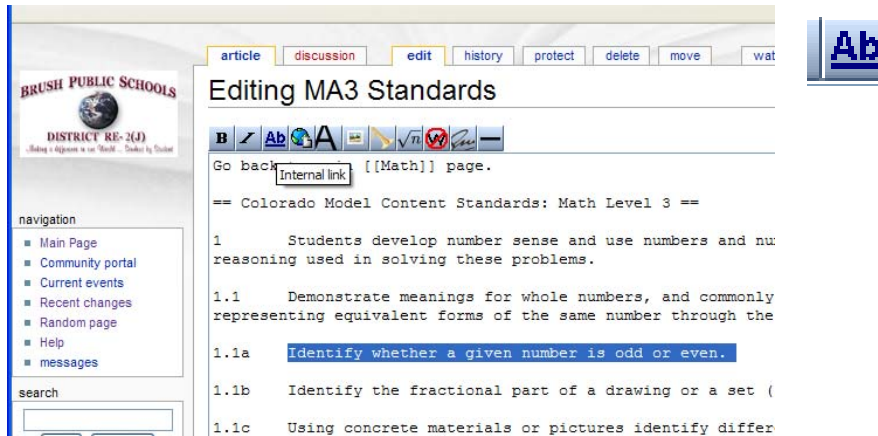
6. Click the **Standards** link below your corresponding grade level or course



7. Click the **Edit** tab at the top of the page



8. Highlight the text of the standard and click the **Internal Link** button on the Wiki toolbar



9. Place your cursor at the beginning of the standard right after the second bracket ([|). Add the following syntax to create a unique name for the page:

Breakdown of page name:

MA	03	1.1a
Content	Grade	Standard

Content Abbreviations:

- MA = Math
- RE = Reading
- WR = Writing
- S = Science
- SS = Social Studies
- TE = Technology
- PE = Physical Education

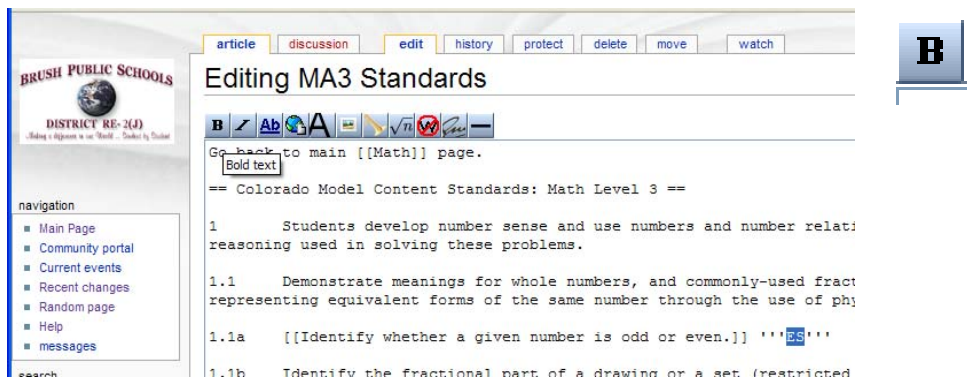

Be sure to insert the horizontal bar (|).

10. Type ES at the end of the standard outside the brackets. Highlight ES and click the **Bold** button on the Wiki toolbar



11. Click the **Save Page** button at the bottom of the page

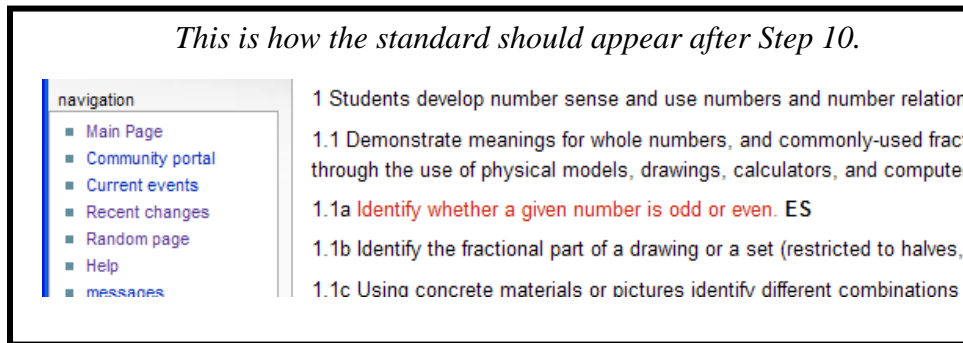

Adding Content

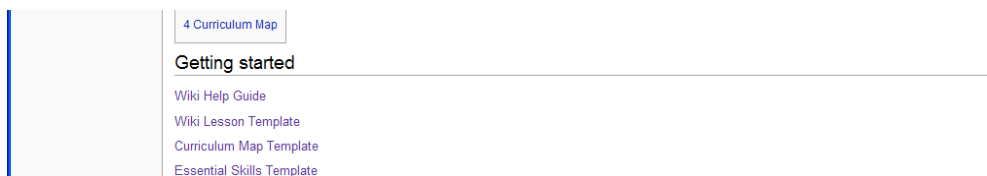
Tips:

- When trying to add a list or separate lines, you need to double space to make it appear single-spaced.
- If text appears in blue boxes, it is because you spaced or tabbed in to start the line

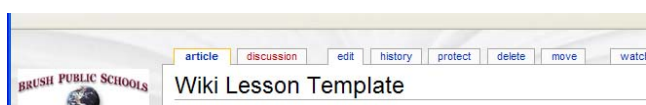
12. Click **Main Page** in the Navigation pane at the left



13. Click the **Wiki Lesson Template** under the *Getting started* heading on the Main Page



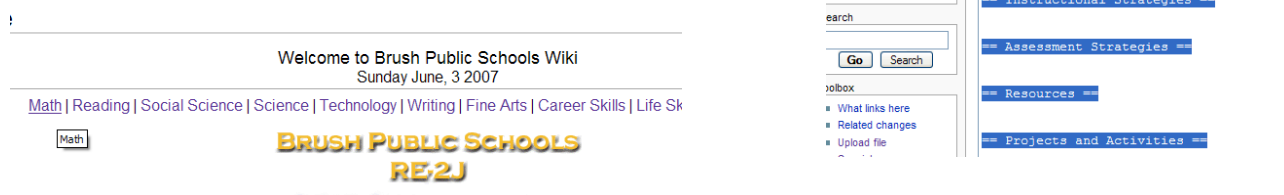
14. Click the **Edit** tab at the top of the page



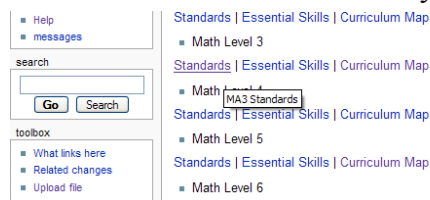
- Place the cursor in the editing pane and click. Press **CTRL + A** (Command+A on a MAC) on your keyboard to Select All text (the text should become highlighted). Press **CTRL + C** (Command+C on a MAC) on your keyboard to Copy the text.

- Click **Main Page** in the Navigation pane at the left (*see Step 1*)

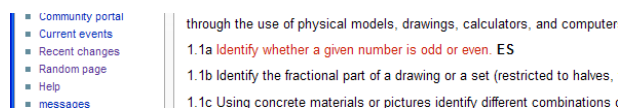
- Click on the Content Area link you want to work on



- Click the **Standards** link below your corresponding grade level or course



- Click your newly created Standard link which should be **Red**



- Click in the Edit pane. Press **CTRL + V** (Command+V on a MAC) on your keyboard to paste the Wiki Lesson Template.

- Edit the text *Content* in the first line of the template to reflect the content area the standard addresses (ie Reading, Writing, Math, ect).

Go back to main [[**Content**]] page

Edit the second line of the template

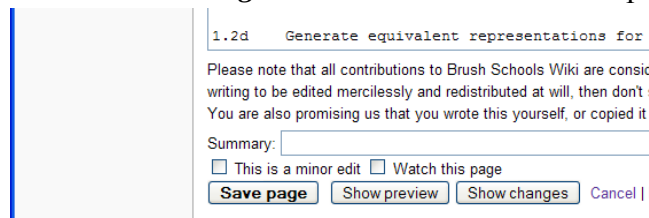

- Click the **Save Page** button at the bottom of the page



- The page is now ready for content.

Adding External Links

Format for adding a link on a Wiki page to an external website.

[<http://www.example.com> link title]



One space between the URL and the Link Title

Example:

[http://www.readwritethink.org/lessons/lesson_view.asp?id=79 The Phantom Tollbooth]

Linking to Uploaded File

To add an internal link, enclose the name of the page you want to link to in double square brackets. When you save the page, you'll see the new link pointing to your page. If the page exists already, it is displayed in blue, empty pages are displayed in red.

Format for linking to a file you have uploaded to the Wiki site (see page 6).

[[Media:File.ext | alt text]]

Example:

[[Media:Literary_devices_.doc | Practice identifying literary devices]]

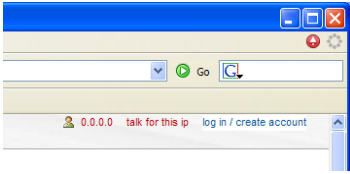
Be sure to insert the horizontal bar (|) between the File Name and Link Title.

Uploading a File

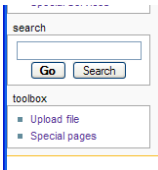
1. Go to <http://wiki.brushschools.org/>
2. Click on the **Log in** link at the top right (Username is your email address)



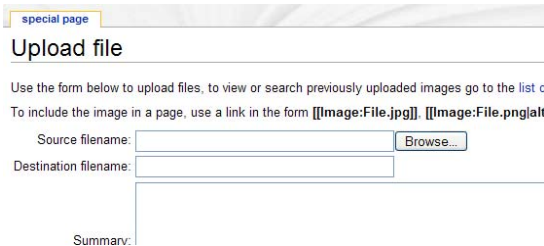
3. Click **Main Page** in the Navigation pane at the left



4. Click on the **Upload File** link in the *toolbox*

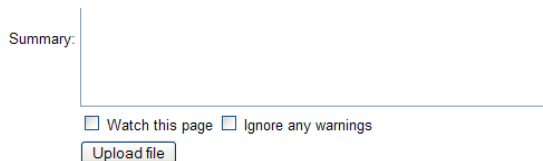


5. Click the **Browse** button



6. Choose the File you want to upload to the Wiki site and Click **Open** in the dialog box

7. Click the **Upload File** button



8. Copy the file name to past in the media link tag on the Standards page
